POSITION PURPOSE

As Assistant Technical Director, you will assist the Technical Director with the planning, supervision, building, installation and strike of UFOMT productions including special projects undertaken by the UFOMT.

POSITION FUNCTIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Construct, install, changeover, and dismantle scenery for all UFOMT productions, including special projects undertaken by UFOMT.
- Research and development of new techniques, processes and materials for scenery construction of IRT productions.
- Locate, order and acquire materials and equipment needed for the Scene Shop.
- Hire over-hire labor and maintain the Scene Shop over-hire list.
- Ensure the smooth operation of the shop and provide guidance and leadership as needed.
- Problem-solving, organization and the ability to carry a project through from start to completion paying close attention to both the big picture and the fine details.
- Organize & maintain the safety and cleanliness of the Scene Shop, Paint Shop, performance spaces and other areas used by the Scene Shop.
- Work with the TD and ATDs on maintenance and repair of Shop tools and safety equipment and keeping them in good working order.
- Maintain a clean and safe working environment
- Manage your time in an effective manner
- Perform such tasks, services, duties, and responsibilities in accordance with UFOMT policies, rules, regulations, and instructions now in force, or which may be adopted from time to time, during Employee's employment at the UFOMT.

- Experience supervising multiple crews working on different projects at the same time.

- Ability to work in a team and maintain a positive attitude.
- Ability to work occasional nights and weekends.
