PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Ensure the efficient installation and maintenance of lighting designs as indicated by the Lighting Designer.
- Ensure the efficient installation and maintenance of sound and audio systems as indicated by the Sound Designers
- Assist Lighting and Sound Designers in the implementation of the design as needed.
- Maintain the UFOMT's lighting and audio inventories as well as computer equipment assigned to the Electrics and Audio Department.
- Oversight and control over department budgets.
- Develop and maintain departmental work processes, goals, and safety standards.
- Establish work hours and calls for department staff.
- Ensure that changeovers between productions occur in a safe, timely, and efficient manner.
- Fill in for staff as needed.
- Provide assistance in continuing education for all members of the department.
- Provide departmental assistance with non-show-related UFOMT events.
- Develop and maintain departmental production schedules, operating lighting, and/or sound equipment for UFOMT productions and space rentals as assigned.
- Perform such tasks, services, duties, and responsibilities in accordance with UFOMT policies, rules, regulations, and instructions now in force or which may be adopted from time to time during Employee's employment at the UFOMT.
